RULES

Each exhibitor must complete a separate entry form.

All Classes are free to enter for under 16s.

All adults pay 30p per exhibit.

There is a maximum of TWO entries per class apart from Cookery (ONE entry per class). Completed entry forms MUST be given to any Committee Member OR handed in at the Nursery Walk Trading Hut OR emailed via website link by Wednesday August 30th 2023. Entry fees should be paid at Nursery Walk Trading Hut OR upon collection of exhibitor cards during staging.

Only Class 8 (One Specimen Rose) may be handed in on the morning of the Show. Class 1 (Bring a Bloom) may be handed in up until 2.30pm on the day of the show after which the class will be open to public ballot.

Please be aware that parking is extremely limited and therefore we request that everyone be considerate of others when arriving to stage exhibits.

Exhibits may be staged Friday 1st September between 6.30pm – 8.30pm and Saturday 2nd September between 8.30am – 10.30am at which point the building will be cleared of all exhibitors for judging to take place. Society vases and paper plates shall be used unless otherwise stated.

Exhibitors staging three entries or over will be given a free entry pass to the show.

No person other than a Steward will be allowed to interfere/rearrange exhibits in any way. Stewards will be on hand to assist should you require help when placing exhibits.

If an exhibitor is also a judge's steward they must not exhibit in a class being marked by their judge.

The Show opens to the public at 2pm.

Judges' decisions are final. Any protest must be delivered in writing not later than 3.00pm on the day of the Show. Verbal protest will not be considered.

In the event of a tied result, the award will be made to the exhibitor with the highest number of 1st places.

No exhibit to be removed until after the trophy presentation at 4pm.

Prize monies to be collected from the Treasurer after 4.15pm.

RHS Banksian Medal – awarded to the exhibitor with the most points

Every year the RHS provides a Banksian Medal to affiliated societies to award to the person who received the most points at their Shows.
